ERIC ESTES FINANCIAL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

At Boulder Dam Credit Union, we believe in investing in the future of our youth by supporting their education and financial literacy journey. The Eric Estes Financial Education Scholarship is a \$1,000 scholarship designed to assist students who have demonstrated a commitment to financial education and are pursuing higher education. This scholarship honors the legacy of former CEO Eric Estes by empowering students to achieve their educational and career aspirations while emphasizing the importance of financial literacy.

Open to High School Seniors, the scholarship requires applicants to demonstrate involvement in our financial literacy programs, such as Moola Moola or High School Understanding Your Money, and submit an essay along with two letters of recommendation. NEW YEAR, NEW PASSWORDS

The beginning of the year is the perfect time to change your passwords for online banking, and other important accounts.

- Never use personal information such as your name, birthday, user name, or email address. This type of information is often publicly available, which makes it easier for someone to guess your password.
- Use a longer password. Your password should be at least six characters long, although for extra security it should be even longer.
- Don't use the same password for each account. If someone discovers your password for one account, all of your other accounts will be vulnerable.
- Try to include numbers, symbols, and both uppercase and lowercase letters.
- Avoid using words that can be found in the dictionary. For example, swimming1 would be a weak password.
- Random passwords are the strongest. If you're having trouble creating one, you can use a password generator instead.
